



Northwest Plumbing Heating & AC Announces Expanded Furnace Maintenance Services for Winter Season

The company's inspection data from the previous heating season revealed that 72 percent of emergency heating failures involved systems that had not received maintenance within the past two years. Common issues identified during inspections include deteriorated heat exchangers, malfunctioning ignition systems, and improperly calibrated thermostats.

Northwest Plumbing Heating & AC has implemented new diagnostic protocols for evaluating furnaces, boilers, geothermal systems, and high-efficiency heating units. The company's technicians complete 40 hours of annual training on current heating technologies and safety standards established by industry manufacturers.

The company also maintains comprehensive plumbing services throughout the year, addressing water heater installations, drain cleaning, and sewer line repairs. This dual service capability enables technicians to evaluate interconnected systems that share infrastructure in residential properties.
